

2022 - 2023 4-H Project Support Resources

It has come to my attention that some of the new leaders and youth may not know where to find all the resources necessary for a successful project. The links and information below are found on the state 4-H website but it can be a bit cumbersome to navigate. Please let me know if there are other tools or resources you would like to have.

- 1) Every project requires a record book. **For 4-H purposes, Juniors are age 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, and senior 14+ as of December 31, 2022.** Many projects have supplemental sheets required for the record books so please read all the way through the lists. It is important that ALL youth including livestock use these record books and not the county records from prior years. They can be found at: <https://co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/colorado-4-h-project-information/> Click on the appropriate area, such as Creative Arts, and it will give you the project choices, information, and e-records – all in printable form.
- 2) Indoor project descriptions and requirements, which will be necessary to complete the indoor project, are found in your [Exhibit Requirements by Division 2022 - 2023](#)
- 3) Score sheets are available for each **indoor** project and will help both you and the youth understand what they will be evaluated on at both the County Fair and the State Fair. Together with the e-record and project description and requirements (the previous two links) should give you all the information you need to complete an indoor project.
